1. Call to Order – Jim Kackman, Chair

The regular meeting of the Kootenai Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Board was called to order by Chair Jim Kackman at 1:30 p.m.

2. Changes to the Agenda and Declarations of Conflicts of Interest - Action Item

Mr. Terry Werner moved to approve the agenda. Mr. Lynn Borders seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

3. Approval of February 14, 2019 KMPO Board Meeting Minutes – Action Item

Mr. John Austin moved for the approval of the February 14, 2019, minutes. Vice Chair Lynn Borders seconded the motion which passed; Mr. Terry Werner noted he had abstained from the vote citing his absence from the meeting.

**4. Public Comments** (limited to non-agenda items 3 minutes)

There were no public comments.

# 5. KCATT Recap & Recommendations – Rob Palus

a. Recap of Activities – February 2019

KCATT Chair, Rob Palus, City of Post Falls, reported the committee had discussed the policies on Critical Arterials Corridors and Railroad Quiet Zones; the documents were sent back for revisions and are expected to be back before KCATT in March. The City of Dalton Garden's mayor, Steven Roberge, attended the February KCATT meeting to discuss their 4<sup>th</sup> Street improvement project; the matter was tabled for further consideration in March.

KCATT had no recommendations before the KMPO Board.

#### 6. Administrative Matters

a. February 2019 KMPO Expenditures & Financial Report – Action Item

Board Member Corinne Johnson arrived at 1:34 p.m.

Mr. Terry Werner moved to approve the expenditures and financial report for February 2019. Mr. Monty Montgomery seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

b. KMPO 2019-2025 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment #4; Kidd Island Road Project (KN 12315), increasing PC Funding in the amount of \$148,000 for consultant services; Incorporate Local, UPRR RRX Closures (KN12977) Scope of Work and Funding in the amount of \$232,000 into the SH-41, Prairie Ave to Lancaster Rd Project, (KN 20098)

Mr. Miles reviewed the 2019-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #4 noting it was an administrative amendment. He explained the amendment process and noted KMPO requests documentation from local jurisdictions to ensure they are aware of the project amendments. No action was required.

### 7. Other Business

There was no business under this agenda item.

## 8. Public Transportation (Informational Items Provided to KMPO)

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a. Kootenai County Transit Update Presentation – Amber Conklin

Mr. Chad Ingle provided the February urban ridership report for Citylink North. He explained and demonstrated the trip planner app, ETA Transit Systems, and provided an update on the transit center construction at Riverstone.

b. Coeur d' Alene Tribe Rural Transit Report – Alan Eirls

Mr. Alan Eirls reported February was a quiet month citing weather conditions and the ongoing construction at the casino. He provided an update on staff changes, and the status of the ITD 4<sup>th</sup> quarter and National Transit Database (NTD) reports. There were two bus incidents – a minor deer strike and a minor brush with a vehicle.

**9. Director's Report** (written report included in Board packet)

Mr. Miles noted the ITD Board appointed Jim Thompson of Sandpoint as the new District 1 representative; the term for the previous representative, Jim Coleman, had expired.

Mr. Miles noted he had recently given a presentation to the Spokane-Kootenai-Bonner Real Estate Market Forum; he discussed transportation projects that will be done over the next few years. Similar presentations will be given to the Executive Roundtable in April and to the Kootenai County Board of Realtors in June.

Mr. Miles commented on Idaho House Bill 88 which proposed funding the Idaho State Police (ISP) out of the general fund; there was no update on the surplus eliminator bill. On the federal level, there have been discussions about adding between ten and twenty-five cents to the federal gas tax. Mr. Miles commented on the next reauthorization bill coming from the U.S. Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works; it is expected to be released this fall.

Mr. Werner noted Idaho House Bill 88 failed 17-18. He commented on the status of House Bill 107, an amending order related to sales tax and the distribution of funds to transportation and bridge projects.

#### 10. Board Member Comments

Mr. Werner reported the District had posted some weight limit signs and is busy removing snow from roadways.

Chair Kackman stated he was looking forward to spring.

Mr. Austin seconded Chair Kackman's comment.

Ms. Johnson commented that it does make a big difference when citizens contact legislators and ask them to vote on various issues.

Mr. Brooks said he appreciated being part of an action group; he will continue to attend.

Chair Kackman thanked Mr. Brooks for his participation.
